We continue to grow at a steady and manageable pace and as such we're helping more and more people and pets in need. This Annual Report will recap our accomplishments and financial activity throughout the 2023 calendar year. Thank you again for being a part of Ruff Haven!



#### JANUARY

In partnership with The Humane Society of Utah, Ruff Haven began delivering pet food to the Tooele Food Bank once a month. A very underserved community in Utah.

#### **APRIL**

Received a Rachael Ray Best Friends grant to provide fence fix-it kits to all municipal shelters in Utah

#### MARCH

Received a \$150,000 state grant to focus on domestic violence survivors and their pets, became the first animalfocused organization to receive state funding

#### MARCH

Oversaw the pet resource area at Project Homeless Connect to provide free vaccines and supplies to attendees with pets



#### MAY

Hired two co-EDs to lead the organization, though still majority volunteer run

#### MAY

Increased our reach for our pet pantry, moving from a local delivery model with DoorDash to a pick-up model (deliveries for medically home-bound pet owners), allowing us to become the state's largest pet pantry



#### AUGUST

Kristina Pulsipher presented at the Best Friends Conference about working with municipal shelters with Animal Care of Davis County

#### APRIL

Marisa Hernandez becomes one of 13 nationally-recognized DEI Trailblazer Honorees for 2023 from The Humane Society of The United States



#### JULY

Formed an official partnership with Utah Naloxone to provide Naloxone kits at outreach events



#### SEPTEMBER

Successfully advocated adding a Pet Support task force to the Salt Lake Valley Coalition to End Homelessness Client-Focused Core Function Group









Purchased the first Ruff Haven vehicle. An ambulance we've updated for mobile outreach, vaccination clinics and more.



#### NOVEMBER

Hosted a Don't Forget the Pets training with Red Rover and Greater Good Charities for statewide partners and community members about best practices for co-sheltering \_\_\_\_\_\_people and pets



#### **OCTOBER**


Successfully advocated adding a pet question to Utah's annual HUD-mandated Point In Time survey


